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

CINCINNATI - When Bengals quarterback Joe Burrow took the microphone at Monday night's Super Bowl Opening Night Fan Rally at Paul Brown Stadium, he could only get a few sentences out before his speech was drowned out by the crowd.

"I'm honored to be the quarterback for such a great organization and the best fans in the world," Burrow said.

It's all that the fans needed to hear. The 30,000 fans who stood in the cold at Paul Brown Stadium started chanting, "MVP."

To kick off Super Bowl week, the Bengals hosted a pep rally to send the Bengals off to Los Angeles. Former Bengals David Fulcher, Tim Krumrie, Max Montoya, Willie Anderson and Ken Anderson described why they saw the Bengals as the Super Bowl champion.

Then the fireworks started over Paul Brown Stadium and "Welcome to the Jungle" blared out of the speakers. The Bengals announced all 25 starters, and it sounded like a playoff game when Burrow walked out of the tunnel.

The 30,000 tickets sold out almost immediately. On Monday, fans were lining up outside Paul Brown Stadium at 3 p.m. for an event that didn't start for another three hours.

When the Bengals captains took the stage to address the team, Bengals running back Joe Mixon thanked the fanbase for sticking with the team through five consecutive losing seasons.

"I know it hasn't been the greatest couple of years," Mixon said. "Y'all

fought through adversity and our players fought through adversity. I appreciate the fans for sticking with us for all these years. We plan to bring that Lombardi Trophy back here."

This is the payoff for 31 years without a playoff win, the lost decade of the 1990s and the draft busts that cycled through the franchise. It's the payoff for the fans who stuck with the team through Carson Palmer's knee injury, Jeremy Hill's fumble and the end of the Marvin Lewis era.

During the fireworks show, most of the Bengals players took out their phones to capture a moment that looked improbable before the season.

"The energy you've had all year is a big reason why we're standing here tonight," Bengals punter Kevin Huber told the fans. "Cincinnati has been my home for 36 years, and I couldn't be more proud to call this place home. Getting a chance to play in a Super Bowl for my hometown team is a dream come true."

Bengals director of player personnel Duke Tobin, who has rarely spoken directly to the fanbase during his time in the front office, was the first member of the organization to step onto the stage.

He warmed up the crowd with a few jokes, including a reference to something Burrow said in a December inter-

"Hi, my name is Duke Tobin," he said. "I don't know who said there's nothing to do in Cincinnati, but this sure looks like something to do in Cincinnati."

Bengals head coach Zac Taylor spoke next and described how it was an honor to coach "a special team playing for a special group of fans in a special city."

Following speeches from Mixon, Burrow, Huber and a few others, tight end C.J. Uzomah was the closer. Uzomah sprained his MCL in the AFC championship game, and he's listed as questionable for the Super Bowl. On Monday, Uzomah walked onto the field wearing a massive brace on his knee.

When it was his turn to speak, Uzomah ripped off the knee brace and threw it 20 feet in the air. Then, he sprinted a full lap around the entire stadium to high-five the fans.

"It's been us from the start of this season," Uzomah said. "It doesn't matter who we play. It's been about us. So next week, we're bringing the game ball home. It is us. Who Dey.'

Blazers finally deal **McCollum**

The CJ McCollum era with the Trail Blazers is finally over.

The Blazers have reached a deal to trade the veteran guard to the Pelicans for Josh Hart, Tomas Satoransky, Nickeil Alexander-Walker, Didi Louzada, a 2022 protected firstround pick and two second-round picks, a person with knowledge of the deal told USA TODAY Sports. The person requested anonymity because they were not authorized to speak publicly about the deal until is announced by both teams.

The Pelicans will also receive Larry Nance and Tony Snell in the trade.

McCollum, drafted 10th in the 2013 draft out of Lehigh, spent his entire career with Portland and teamed up with Damian Lillard to form one of the best backcourts in the NBA. The Blazers have made the playoffs in eight consecutive seasons, reaching the Western Conference finals 2019. But the past few seasons there has been plenty of talk about breaking up that combination, and it finally hap-

Here are the grades on the trade for both teams:

New Orleans: B+

So much of this deal depends on Zion Williamson's health, and even if Williamson isn't healthy acquiring a player who has averaged at least 20 points the past seven seasons is valuable. But let's figure Williamson, who has not played this season, is healthy to play at some point. That gives the Pelicans a starting lineup of Devonte' Graham, McCollum, Brandon Ingram, Williamson and Jonas Valanciunas with talented and surprising rookie Herbert Jones, a great second-round pick, in the rotation. The Pelicans have moved into 10th place, which would put them in playin game contention. Looking ahead to next season and a healthy roster, the Pelicans could be a team that is in the top-six in the West, especially if they add more depth. McCollum comes with a price tag (\$33.3 million in 2022-23 and \$35.8 million in 2023-24). The Pelicans are planning on it being worth the investment.

Portland: B-

Trading McCollum wasn't easy. He is friends with Blazers star Damian Lillard, and they have helped the Blazers to a modicum of success just enough success with five firstround playoff losses in the past eight seasons. Even before Lillard sustained an abdominal injury and had surgery on Jan. 13, the Blazers lagged behind the contenders in the standings. Interim general manager Joe Cronin just made his second trade following a deal that sent Normal Powell and Robert Covington to the Clippers last week. Cronin is trying to gather enough assets and flexibility to make the Blazers better through trades, draft picks, a \$20 million trade exception and salary cap space.

Rams 'fully embrace' expectations

Walk Hollywood Boulevard and you will see A-list celebrities immortalized in stars on the sidewalk.

Some of the biggest award shows in music and entertainment are in Los Angeles. There's Malibu, Santa Monica, Venice Beach, and indefinite palm trees and sunshine. Just ask R&B group Tony! Toni! Toné!, and they'll tell you "it never

The point is, there is always something to pique the interests of Southern California residents.

"It's amazing, man. It's where the stars of the stars are at. You got LeBron James out here. You got everybody out here," Chargers Pro Bowl strong safety Derwin James told USA TODAY Sports+. "You got Hollywood out here."

To capture the attention of casual sports fans in LA, sports franchises must win.

The Lakers and Dodgers are part of the fabric of Los Angeles because of sustained success. The Lakers have 17 NBA championships – tied with the Boston Celtics for the most in the league. Twelve of those titles were won after the Lakers moved to the city. Six of the seven Dodgers' World Series wins were in

Even on the college level, UCLA and Southern Cal have over 200 NCAA team titles combined. It is paramount for a team to win in Los Angeles. It's almost a rite of passage.

The Rams are keenly aware.

"There's a history and legacy of great championship-caliber teams," Rams head coach Sean McVay said. "I think that's kind of the standard that's been set when you look at some of the organizations and franchises in other sports industries that are in this market. That's a thing that our guys love. If you're gonna compete, you want to do it at the highest level and never run away from the expectations. We understand that you have to be able to earn that confidence.

"But I think with the players that we have, there is a swagger and there is a confidence. You love that, and you love this city and everything that it entails in terms of the expectations that come with that. That is something that we fully embrace."

The Lakers and Dodgers won titles as recently as 2020. No U.S. city is accustomed to winning more than Los Ange-

"Being from here, you got to win championships," said Rams wide receiver Robert Woods, who suffered a season-ending knee injury in November. "Watching the Lakers and watching the Dodgers both winning recently in the same year, it will be really sweet if we can just get a clean sweep in all three sports. It will be pretty dynamic and memorable."

A clean sweep is within reach.

The Rams are at the precipice of their first Super Bowl title as an LA franchise (the club won Super Bowl 34 as the St. Louis Rams). They are set to become to first team in NFL history to play a conference championship game and a Super Bowl at their home stadium.

The franchise made bold moves to be in this exact situation, mortgaging their future to win Super Bowl 56. They don't have a first-round pick until the 2024 draft after trades to acquire key pieces such as quarterback Matthew Stafford and pass rusher Von Miller.

So far, that gamble is paying off.

All that stands in the Rams' way of a Lombardi Trophy are the Cincinnati Bengals, a team in the midst of an improbable turnaround.

Several Rams players indicated they want to win a Super Bowl for three-time NFL Defensive Player of the Year Aaron Donald, but in totality it's Super Bowl or bust this year.

The Rams and Chargers are in the process of establishing themselves and staking their claim in the City of Angels. The Rams have a prime opportunity to do it first and gain the hearts of Angelenos.

"It's a championship vibe. It's a championship city," Woods said. "That's our goal here."
