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

The achievement this season is nota-ble given the disadvantage West Coast schools faced. COVID-19 concerns in those states led to much of the summer activities being lost, as other conferences had players on campus and could oversee workout regimens.

The Pac-12's success over the first weekend of the tournament can't be written off on easy brackets. The paths haven't been easy, partly because the tournament committee wasn't high on any of the teams.

Oregon, the regular-season champi-

on, somehow was a No. 7 seed, yet blew away one of the Big Ten's top dogs in No. 2 seed Iowa. Southern California, which finished second in the league and was seeded sixth, wiped out Big 12 standard-bearer Kansas, a No. 3 seed.

The Atlanta Hawks and Portland Trail Blazers did so, essentially, in their own locker room: Fourteen of 17 Hawks players and 36 basketball operations players and 36 basketball operations members overall were vaccinated after a March 19 game; all who were vaccinated met Georgia standards to qualify for the vaccine, which for players included a body mass index exceeding 25.

Monday, the Blazers announced 13 Monday, the Blazers announced I3 players received their first dose of the Moderna vaccine, gaining access, they said in a statement, to an "excess supply of vaccines through the Confederated Tribes of Grand Ronde who began offering the vaccine to the general public in February as a way to help Oregon, and the Nation, move past the pandemic." Multiple New Orleans Pelicans play-ers were vaccinated March 14, days after

some eligibility restrictions were loos-ened in Louisiana.

Older coaches and managers, such as the San Antonio Spurs' Gregg Popovich (who turned 72 in January) and Hous-ton Astros' Dusty Baker (71), have con-

firmed their vaccinations.
