PROJECT EXPERIENCE



Catalina Parking Garage: GLHN designed a new parking structure for Plaza Companies in the iconic Park Central neighborhood of downtown Phoenix. It is currently the tallest parking structure in Arizona. The garage needed to fit within the established design theme for the Park Central Redevelopment project which also includes the renovated Park Central Mall, Dignity Health’s headquarter office, Creighton University’s new medical school, and multifamily housing.

McClelland Hall Addition: GLHN was part of the team to design an addition to the McClelland Hall Professional Development Center for the University of Arizona. The addition is located on levels 2 and 3 of the existing 4 story building and retained an opening to the courtyard. Respect for the original architecture and integration of the new space into the old were key design concerns as well as providing flexibility for future uses.

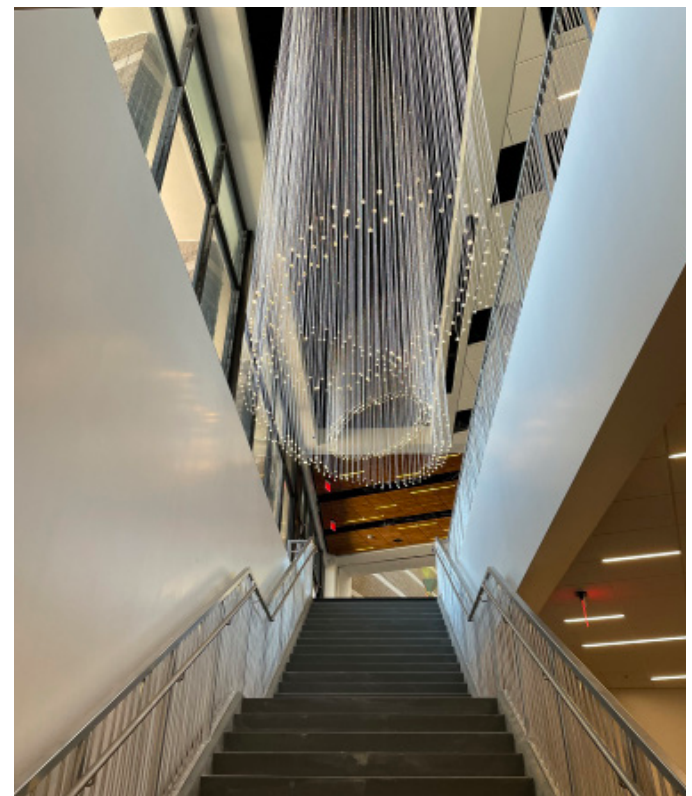


PROJECT EXPERIENCE



Ballroom & Exhibit Hall Renovation: GLHN was A/E of Record in developing design and construction documents for the Ballroom and Exhibition Hall Renovation at the iconic Tucson Convention Center. The challenge was to be reverent to existing design while bringing the building up to date. Old systems were modernized in the existing building. A new meeting rooms addition was also included in our scope. An additional 36,000 SF was added to provide 10 meeting rooms with associated restrooms.

College of Pharmacy Addition and Renovation: GLHN is the Architect of Record for the expansion of the College of Pharmacy providing the College with both new and renovated state-of-the-art facilities to ensure its growth and capacity to adapt to the dynamic and changing fields in pharmaceutical sciences. Based on a concept plan prepared by GLHN, the project entails a two-story addition to the existing building, totaling approximately 19,000 SF of new research lab, support, and office space. The existing building renovations total approximately 12,000 SF and include existing lab, support, and office space.



Coconino County Sheep Hill Maintenance Facility Renovations: GLHN is providing Architecture and MEP services as consultant to the prime. Our professional services for a series of renovations at the Coconino County Sheep Hill Maintenance Facility. Phase 1 includes a facility assessment and conceptual design report.

Pima County Public Service Center: GLHN is the Architect and Engineer of Record for the renovation to the Pima County Public Service Center Courts and Parking Structure.

Pima County Administration Renovation: GLHN is AE designer for the 6,800 SF renovation project provided space for two very different programmed spaces. The Communications Department, which is open to the public and the Justice Department, which required privacy for their clients.



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
