BID FORM 5: PINELLAS COUNTY DISTRICT SCHOOLS BID PROTEST PROCEDURE

Bidders who wishes to file a protest pertaining to a bid must file such notice in accordance with procedures prescribed by 120.57(3) FS enumerated below. For bids solicited by the purchasing department, the notice must be filed with the director of purchasing. For bids solicited by the facilities department, the notice must be filed with the director of facilities.

- 1. Any person who is adversely affected by the District decision or intended decision shall file with the Director of Purchasing a notice of protest in writing within 72 hours after the posting of the bid tabulation or after receipt of the notice of the District decision or intended decision and shall file a formal written protest within 10 days after filing the notice of protest. With respect to a protest of the specifications contained in an invitation to bid or in a request for proposals, the notice of protest shall be filed in writing within 72 hours after the receipt of notice of the project plans and specifications or intended project plans and specifications in an invitation to bid or request for proposals, and the formal written protest shall be filed within 10 days after the date the notice of protest is filed. Failure to file a notice of protest or failure to file a formal written protest shall state with particularity the facts and law upon which the protest is based. Saturdays, Sundays, and legal holidays shall be excluded in the computation of the 72-hour time periods provided by this paragraph.
- 2. Any person who files an action protesting a decision or intended decision pertaining to a bid pursuant to FS 120.57(3)(b), shall post at the time of filing the formal written protest, a bond payable to the Pinellas County School District in an amount equal to 1 percent (1%) of the total estimated contract value, but not less than \$500 nor more than \$5,000, which bond shall be conditioned upon the payment of all costs which may be adjudged against the protester in the administrative hearing in which the action is brought and in any subsequent appellate court proceeding. In lieu of a bond, a cashier's check, certified bank check, bank certified company check, money order or U.S. currency will be acceptable form of security. If, after completion of the administrative hearing process and any appellate court proceedings, the District prevails, it shall recover all costs and charges which shall be included in the final order or judgment, including charges by the protester, the protest security shall be returned. If the protester prevails, he or she shall recover from the District all costs and charges which shall be included in the final order of security attorney's fees.
- 3. Upon receipt of the formal written protest and protest bond which has been timely filed, the District shall stop the bid solicitation process or the contract award process until the subject of the protest is resolved by final District action, unless the Superintendent sets forth in writing particular facts and circumstances which require the continuance of the bid solicitation process or the contract award process without delay in order to avoid an immediate and serious danger to the public health, safety, or welfare.

- a) The District shall provide an opportunity to resolve the protest by mutual agreement between the parties within 7 days, excluding Saturdays, Sundays, and legal holidays, after receipt of a formal written protest.
- b) If the subject of a protest is not resolved by mutual agreement within 7 days, excluding Saturdays, Sundays, and legal holidays, after receipt of the formal written protest, and if there is no disputed issue of material fact, an informal proceeding shall be conducted pursuant to 120.57(2) FS and applicable District rules before a person whose qualifications have been prescribed by rules of the District.
- c) If the subject of a protest is not resolved by mutual agreement within 7 days, excluding Saturdays, Sundays, and legal holidays, after receipt of the formal written protest, and if there is a disputed issue of material fact, the District shall refer the protest to the Division of Administrative Hearings for proceedings under 120.57(1) FS.
- 5. Upon receipt of a formal written protest referred pursuant to this subsection, the director of the Division of Administrative Hearings shall expedite the hearing and assign an administrative law judge who shall commence a hearing within 30 days after the receipt of the formal written protest by the division and enter a recommended order within 30 days after the hearing or within 30 days after receipt of the hearing transcript by the administrative law judge, whichever is later. Each party shall be allowed 10 days in which to submit written exceptions to the recommended order. A final order shall be entered by the District within 30 days of the entry of a recommended order. The provisions of this paragraph may be waived upon stipulation by all parties.
- 6. In a competitive-procurement protest, no submissions made after the bid or proposal opening amending or supplementing the bid or proposal shall be considered. Unless otherwise provided by statute, the burden of proof shall rest with the party protesting the proposed District action. In a competitive-procurement protest, other than a rejection of all bids, the administrative law judge shall conduct a de novo proceeding to determine whether the District's proposed action is contrary to the District's governing statutes, the District's rules or policies, or the bid or proposal specifications. The standard of

proof for such proceedings shall be whether the proposed District action was clearly erroneous, contrary to competition, arbitrary, or capricious. When assigned a job order, our pre-construction teams will immediately spring into action, by inviting the local DBE subs, other local subs and vendors who have the necessary expertise and skills to accomplish the task. Working close with our project management team, the preconstruction team makes sure the subs and vendors are preparing their proposals to accomplish their portion of the work at a fair and reasonable price. Our team goes further by explaining to the vendors the quality and safety expectations that are expected by JLC as well as the Agency.

Once all of the bids from subs and vendors are received, our preconstruction team scopes out each and every quote, comparing each quote to the other for the same identified work. This creates fairness to all parties involve and helps our team produce the best project for our clients.

Johnson-Laux Construction, LLC Construction is a WBE firm and graduate FDOT & GDOT DBE Firm. We promise to work tirelessly to meet and exceed any MBE goals for this contract by continuously seeking out and informing all M/WBE and DBE firms of the opportunities available, right-sizing subcontracts scopes where required or needed.





13. Diversity Program - continued

JLC understands the necessity of performance and payments bonds in construction contracting. However, we believe that many local subcontractors have the ability and experience to perform the work, but often times requiring subcontractors to furnish bonds will eliminate this opportunity. At JLC, we do not require a subcontractor bond on any subcontractor whose contract work value is under \$500,000. If a certain scope of work may goes over this amount, our preconstruction team will find ways to right size the scope in an effort to get the most participation from the approved DBE subs and vendors.

Upon award of this Contract, it is our intention to continue as well as increase our marketing and outreach plan as follows:

- Expanding our existing data base by identifying and contacting any M/WBE contractors and vendors that did not respond during the initial solicitation via phone, fax, email, newspaper/media advertisements and/ or announcements.
- Utilizing our organized (by trade categories) directory/database by providing all qualified M/WBE firms with project updates and job order solicitations.
- Establish regular communications with the Agency on advice, updates, program changes, events, and all other outreach methods to ensure that no stone is left unturned .
- Attending local M/WBE applicable events, fairs, expos, and trade shows in order to maximize the exposure of the Contract and available M/WBE subcontractor opportunities available.

22. Provide your company's subcontracting plan, as described in the scope herein.

Johnson-Laux construction will self-perform all pre-construction services with no subcontractors nor joint-ventures. The goal of our subcontractor acquisition is to obtain highly qualified subcontractor services while still maintain best value for our clients. To achieve this goal and ensure that the on-site construction team receives construction services for each trade, Johnson-Laux has developed the following subcontractor acquisition and management procedures:

Subcontractor Acquisition:

Johnson-Laux has established a reputation of being a solid performer for our clients and a reputation of being a dependable Construction Manager across Florida, Georgia, and South Carolina. We have databases for a host of Subcontractors in all the trades. We have established very solid relationships with the subcontractors, and have established a process for the evaluation and selection process of subcontractors. The criteria are set based on a weighted average method of calculations with safety being the most important criteria.

In spite of having this extensive database of qualified and reliable subcontractors, Johnson-Laux, is always on the lookout for qualified subcontractors, to be more competitive in the industry. Johnson-Laux uses available Internet databases to find and invite to vendors to participate on its projects. Johnson-Laux collects information for these expos and implements the selection process using a scaled method of selection criteria as noted in the previous paragraph.

Concurrent with preparing our eGordian estimate, The Preconstruction team will:

- Prepare vendor work packages that include tasks for each trade This is done to minimize our risk in pricing (assuring there is no gaps and preventing two subs including in their prices the same scope of work)
- Identify in the specifications and estimate section of the proposal form the specifications/drawings
 pertaining to the requirement and contract clauses and provisions that are required to be passed on to the
 subcontractors, i.e., labor standards, EEO standards, Buy American Act, etc.
- Prepare a proposal schedule so that each subcontractor will understand schedule expectations
- Include an example subcontractor agreement to minimize any contractually issues early in the process
- Determine subcontractor availability Johnson-Laux is fully willing to comply with any and all Small Business Contracting requirements for the project. We will solicit, pre-qualify, scope, and negotiate with any Small Business Concern deemed a requirement. Prepare a list of pre-qualified subcontractors.
- Publicly advertise and solicit competitive lump sum bids/proposals from trade contractors or subcontractors for the performance of all major elements of the work.
- Invite a minimum of three subcontractors from our subcontractor database to submit proposals for each Work Package. We will provide a list of which subcontractors were invited to propose and which submitted proposals.
- Notify the Agency in writing in advance of all bid related meetings to include pre-bid meetings and bid/ proposal openings.

Subcontract Execution:

Upon receipt and opening of the bids, Johnson-Laux preconstruction team will work with the construction team in determining the proposal that provides the best value to the Agency.

After acceptance of a subcontractor's proposal, the Project Manager will prepare a bilateral purchase order/ subcontractor agreement, using Johnson-Laux's current formats. The bilateral subcontract agreement will incorporate the specification, drawings, required "flow-down" contract clauses/provision, and other pertinent data for both parties signature. Johnson-Laux will award subcontracts consistent with the small business/small disadvantaged business-subcontracting plan required by the county.

Once Johnson-Laux enters into agreements with a subcontractor, they become a member of our team. We will involve the subcontractors in the planning and scheduling phases, instruct them in safety policies and procedures, and include them in our quality control program. Each subcontractor is expected to follow the schedule and procedures, and a commitment will be obtained from each subcontractor to comply with contract terms and project schedule.

Subcontractor Administration:

During the construction of the project, Johnson-Laux will supervise and inspect the work of all subcontractors as carefully as the work performed by its own crews. We will initiate and implement close communications with each subcontractor through correspondence, weekly progress meetings, Weekly Safety meetings, and Quality Assurance preparatory meetings.

Quality Assurance of Subcontractors:

Through the policy of selecting the "best-value" subcontractors as stated in the preceding section ensures only the qualified subcontractors are selected for participation with us on the project. Further, the policy of obtaining their commitment to us through a certified statement of their commitment to its philosophy of quick response and quality work in essence promotes a "partnering agreement" for each of us to follow. We believe the partnering process with subcontractors will go a long way towards quality of work. Additionally, our pro-active quality control plan and procedures ensures early identification of problems and allows Johnson-Laux to step in and provide needed assistance or complete job takeover.

Non-performance by Subcontractors:

We do what we can to make sure we select the best subcontractors for the project. However we also understand that there may be a subcontractor not performing to our expectations. Also infrequent, we do have a plan to work with that subcontractor to get them to perform to acceptable levels. In the event of non-performance of subcontractors, Johnson-Laux will issue a written cure notice to the subcontractor directing it to rectify the problems within 48 hours of the notification. If the subcontractor fails to correct the problem or there is recurring problem with the performance, we will use labor contractors for the specific trade, to provide it with skilled hourly wage workers. These crews will work directly under the supervision of Johnson-Laux foreman towards the completion of the work. In the case of specialty trades which cannot be performed by its crew, Johnson-Laux will obtain the services of another contractor who can perform the work within the contractually obligated performance period.







 (c) The term does not include:

- (1) A cooperative research and development agreement as defined in 15 U.S.C. 3710a; or

- (ii) A subsidy;
- (iii) A loan;
- (iv) A loan guarantee; or
- (v) Insurance.

Federal awarding agency means the Federal agency that provides a Federal award directly to a non-Federal entity

Federal award has the meaning, depending on the context, in either paragraph (a) or (b) of this section:

(a)(1) The Federal financial assistance that a non–Federal entity receives directly from a Federal awarding agency or indirectly from a pass-through entity, as described in § 200.101 Applicability; or

(2) The cost-reimbursement contract under the Federal Acquisition Regulations that a non–Federal entity receives directly from a Federal awarding agency or indirectly from a pass-through entity, as described in § 200.101 Applicability.

(b) The instrument setting forth the terms and conditions. The instrument is the grant agreement, cooperative agreement, other agreement for assistance covered in paragraph (b) of § 200.40 Federal financial assistance, or the cost-reimbursement contract awarded under the Federal Acquisition Regulations.

(c) Federal award does not include other contracts that a Federal agency uses to buy goods or services from a contractor or a contract to operate Federal government owned, contractor operated facilities (GOCOs).

(d) See also definitions of Federal financial assistance, grant agreement, and cooperative agreement.

Non–Federal entity means a state, local government, Indian tribe, institution of higher education (IHE), or nonprofit organization that carries out a Federal award as a recipient or subrecipient.

Nonprofit organization means any corporation, trust, association, cooperative, or other organization, not including IHEs, that:

(a) Is operated primarily for scientific, educational, service, charitable, or similar purposes in the public interest;

(b) Is not organized primarily for profit; and

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(c) Uses net proceeds to maintain, improve, or expand the operations of the organization.

Obligations means, when used in connection with a non–Federal entity's utilization of funds under a Federal award, orders placed for property and services, contracts and subawards made, and similar transactions during a given period that require payment by the non–Federal entity during the same or a future period.

Pass-through entity means a non–Federal entity that provides a subaward to a subrecipient to carry out part of a Federal program.

Recipient means a non–Federal entity that receives a Federal award directly from a Federal awarding agency to carry out an activity under a Federal program. The term recipient does not include subrecipients.

Simplified acquisition threshold means the dollar amount below which a non–Federal entity may purchase property or services using small purchase methods. Non–Federal entities adopt small purchase procedures in order to expedite the purchase of items costing less than the simplified acquisition threshold. The simplified acquisition threshold is set by the Federal Acquisition Regulation at 48 CFR Subpart 2.1 (Definitions) and in accordance with 41 U.S.C. 1908. As of the publication of this part, the simplified acquisition threshold is \$250,000, but this threshold is periodically adjusted for inflation. (Also see definition of § 200.67 Micro-purchase.)

Subaward means an award provided by a pass-through entity to a subrecipient for the subrecipient to carry out part of a Federal award received by the pass-through entity. It does not include payments to a contractor or payments to an individual that is a beneficiary of a Federal program. A subaward may be provided through any form of legal agreement, including an agreement that the pass-through entity considers a contract.

Subrecipient means a non–Federal entity that receives a subaward from a pass-through entity to carry out part of a Federal program; but does not include an individual that is a beneficiary of such program. A subrecipient may also be a recipient of other Federal awards directly from a Federal awarding agency.

Termination means the ending of a Federal award, in whole or in part at any time prior to the planned end of period of performance.

The following certifications and provisions may be required and apply when Participating Agency expends federal funds for any purchase resulting from this procurement process. The contractor will take such action with respect to any subcontract or purchase order as may be directed by the Secretary of Labor as a means of enforcing such provisions including sanctions for noncompliance: *Provided*, however, that in the event the contractor becomes involved in, or is threatened with, litigation with a subcontractor or vendor as a result of such direction, the contractor may request the United States to enter into such litigation to protect the interests of the United States.

- (2) The contractor will, in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by or on behalf of the contractor, state that all qualified applicants will receive considerations for employment without regard to race, color, religion, sex, or national origin.
- (3) The contractor will send to each labor union or representative of workers with which he has a collective bargaining agreement or other contract or understanding, a notice to be provided advising the said labor union or workers' representatives of the contractor's commitments under this section, and shall post copies of the notice in conspicuous places available to employees and applicants for employment.
- (4) The contractor will comply with all provisions of Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965, and of the rules, regulations, and relevant orders of the Secretary of Labor.
- (5) The contractor will furnish all information and reports required by Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965, and by rules, regulations, and orders of the Secretary of Labor, or pursuant thereto, and will permit access to his books, records, and accounts by the administering agency and the Secretary of Labor for purposes of investigation to ascertain compliance with such rules,

regulations, and orders.

- (6) In the event of the contractor's noncompliance with the nondiscrimination clauses of this contract or with any of the said rules, regulations, or orders, this contract may be canceled, terminated, or suspended in whole or in part and the contractor may be declared ineligible for further Government contracts or federally assisted construction contracts in accordance with procedures authorized in Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965, and such other sanctions as may be imposed and remedies invoked as provided in Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965, or by rule, regulation, or order of the Secretary of Labor, or as otherwise provided bylaw.
- (7) The contractor will include the portion of the sentence immediately preceding paragraph (1) and the provisions of paragraphs (1) through (7) in every subcontract or purchase order unless exempted by rules, regulations, or orders of the Secretary of Labor issued pursuant to section 204 of Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965, so that such provisions will be binding upon each subcontractor or vendor. The contractor will take such action with respect to any subcontract or purchase order as the administering agency may direct as a means of enforcing such provisions, including sanctions for noncompliance: Provided, however, That in the event a contractor becomes involved in, or is threatened with, litigation with a subcontractor or vendor as a result of such direction by the administering agency the contractor may request the United States to enter into such litigation to protect the interests of the United States."

4. Davis Bacon Act and Copeland Anti-KickbackAct.

- a. <u>Applicability of Davis-Bacon Act</u>. The Davis-Bacon Act only applies to the emergency Management Preparedness Grant Program, Homeland Security Grant Program, Nonprofit Security Grant Program, Tribal Homeland Security Grant Program, Port Security Grant Program, and Transit Security Grant Program. <u>It does not apply to</u> <u>other FEMA grant and cooperative agreement programs, including the Public</u> <u>Assistance Program</u>.
- All prime construction contracts in excess of \$2,000 awarded by non-Federal entities must include a provision for compliance with the Davis-Bacon Act (40 U.S.C. §§ 3141-3144 and 3146-3148) as supplemented by Department of Labor regulations at 29 C.F.R. Part 5 (Labor Standards Provisions Applicable to Contracts Covering Federally Financed and Assisted Construction)). See 2 C.F.R. Part 200, Appendix II, ¶ D.
- c. In accordance with the statute, contractors must be required to pay wages to laborers and mechanics at a rate not less than the prevailing wages specified in a wage determination made by the Secretary of Labor. In addition, contractors must be required to pay wages not less than once a week.
- d. The non-Federal entity must place a copy of the current prevailing wage determination issued by the Department of Labor in each solicitation. The decision to award a contract or subcontract must be conditioned upon the acceptance of the wage determination. The non-Federal entity must report all suspected or reported violations to the Federal awarding agency.
- e. In contracts subject to the Davis-Bacon Act, the contracts must also include a provision for compliance with the Copeland "Anti-Kickback" Act (40 U.S.C. § 3145), as supplemented by Department of Labor regulations at 29 C.F.R. Part 3 (Contractors

and Subcontractors on Public Building or Public Work Financed in Whole or in Part by Loans or Grants from the United States). The Copeland Anti- Kickback Act provides that each contractor or subrecipient must be prohibited from inducing, by any means, any person employed in the construction, completion, or repair of public work, to give up any part of the compensation to which he or she is otherwise entitled. The non-Federal entity must report all suspected or reported violations to FEMA.

f. The regulation at 29 C.F.R. § 5.5(a) does provide the required contract clause that applies to compliance with both the Davis-Bacon and Copeland Acts. However, as discussed in the previous subsection, the Davis-Bacon Act does not apply to Public Assistance recipients and subrecipients. In situations where the Davis-Bacon Act does not apply, neither does the Copeland "Anti-Kickback Act." However, for purposes of grant programs where both clauses do apply, FEMA requires the following contract clause:

"Compliance with the Copeland "Anti-Kickback" Act.

- (1) Contractor. The contractor shall comply with 18 U.S.C. § 874, 40U.S.C. § 3145, and the requirements of 29 C.F.R. pt. 3 as may be applicable, which are incorporated by reference into this contract.
- (2) Subcontracts. The contractor or subcontractor shall insert in any subcontracts the clause above and such other clauses as the FEMA may by appropriate instructions require, and also a clause requiring the subcontractors to include these clauses in any lower tier subcontracts. The prime contractor shall be responsible for the compliance by any subcontractor or lower tier subcontractor with all of these contract clauses
- (3) Breach. A breach of the contract clauses above may be grounds for termination of the contract, and for debarment as a contractor and subcontractor as provided in 29 C.F.R. § 5.12."

5. Contract Work Hours and SafetyStandards Act.

- a. <u>Applicability</u>: This requirement applies to all FEMA grant and cooperative agreement programs.
- b. Where applicable (see 40 U.S.C. § 3701), all contracts awarded by the non-Federal entity in excess of \$100,000 that involve the employment of mechanics or laborers must include a provision for compliance with 40 U.S.C. §§ 3702 and 3704, as supplemented by Department of Labor regulations at 29 C.F.R. Part 5. See 2 C.F.R. Part 200, Appendix II, ¶ E.
- c. Under 40 U.S.C. § 3702, each contractor must be required to compute the wages of every mechanic and laborer on the basis of a standard work week of 40 hours. Work in excess of the standard work week is permissible provided that the worker is compensated at a rate of not less than one and a half times the basic rate of pay for all hours worked in excess of 40 hours in the workweek.
- d. The requirements of 40 U.S.C. § 3704 are applicable to construction work and provide that no laborer or mechanic must be required to work in surroundings or under working conditions which are unsanitary, hazardous or dangerous. These requirements do not apply to the purchases of supplies or materials or articles ordinarily available on the open market, or contracts for transportation or transmission of intelligence.

e. The regulation at 29 C.F.R. § 5.5(b) provides the required contract clause concerning compliance with the Contract Work Hours and Safety Standards Act:

"Compliance with the Contract Work Hours and Safety Standards Act.

- (1) <u>Overtime requirements</u>. No contractor or subcontractor contracting for any part of the contract work which may require or involve the employment of laborers or mechanics shall require or permit any such laborer or mechanic in any workweek in which he or she is employed on such work to work in excess of forty hours in such workweek unless such laborer or mechanic receives compensation at a rate not less than one and one-half times the basic rate of pay for all hours worked in excess of forty hours in such workweek.
- (2) <u>Violation; liability for unpaid wages; liquidated damages</u>. In the event of any violation of the clause set forth in paragraph (1) of this section the contractor and any subcontractor responsible therefor shall be liable for the unpaid wages. In addition, such contractor and subcontractor shall be liable to the United States (in the case of work done under contract for the District of Columbia or a territory, to such District or to such territory), for liquidated damages. Such liquidated damages shall be computed with respect to each individual laborer or mechanic, including watchmen and guards, employed in violation of the clause set forth in paragraph (1) of this section, in the sum of \$10 for each calendar day on which such individual was required or permitted to work in excess of the standard workweek of forty hours without payment of the overtime wages required by the clause set forth in paragraph (1) of this section.
- (3) <u>Withholding for unpaid wages and liquidated damages</u>. The (write in the name of the Federal agency or the loan or grant recipient) shall upon its own action or upon written request of an authorized representative of the Department of Labor withhold or cause to be withheld, from any moneys payable on account of work performed by the contractor or subcontractor under any such contract or any other Federal contract with the same prime contractor, or any other federally-assisted contract subject to the Contract Work Hours and Safety Standards Act, which is held by the same prime contractor, such sums as may be determined to be necessary to satisfy any liabilities of such contractor or subcontractor for unpaid wages and liquidated damages as provided in the clause set forth in paragraph (2) of this section.
- (4) <u>Subcontracts</u>. FEMA awards under these programs do not meet the definition of "funding agreement."

- b. This term also includes any assignment, substitution of parties, or subcontract of any type entered into for the performance of experimental, developmental, or research work under a funding agreement as defined in the first sentence of this paragraph.
- 7. <u>Clean Air Act and the Federal Water Pollution Control Act</u>. Contracts of amounts in excess of \$150,000 must contain a provision that requires the contractor to agree to comply with all applicable standards, orders, or regulations issued pursuant to the Clean Air Act (42 U.S.C.§§ 7401-7671q) and the Federal Water Pollution Control Act as amended (33 U.S.C. §§ 1251-1387).  - (2) The contractor agrees to report each violation to the (name of the state agency or local or Indian tribal government) and understands and agrees that the (name of the state agency or local or Indian tribal government) will, in turn, report each violation as required to assure notification to the (name of recipient), Federal Emergency Management Agency, and the appropriate Environmental Protection Agency Regional Office.
 - (3) The contractor agrees to include these requirements in each subcontract exceeding \$150,000 financed in whole or in part with Federal assistance provided by FEMA.

Federal Water Pollution Control Act

(1) The contractor agrees to comply with all applicable standards, orders or regulations issued pursuant to the Federal Water Pollution Control Act, as amended, 33 U.S.C. 1251 et seq.

- (2) The contractor agrees to report each violation to the (name of the state agency or local or Indian tribal government) and understands and agrees that the (name of the state agency or local or Indiantribal government) will, in turn, report each violation as required to assure notification to the (name of recipient), Federal Emergency Management Agency, and the appropriate Environmental Protection Agency Regional Office.
- (3) The contractor agrees to include these requirements in each subcontract exceeding \$150,000 financed in whole or in part with Federal assistance provided by FEMA."
- 8. <u>Debarment and Suspension</u>.
 - a. <u>Applicability:</u> This requirement applies to all FEMA grant and cooperative agreement programs.
 - b. Non-federal entities and contractors are subject to the debarment and suspension regulations implementing Executive Order 12549, *Debarment and Suspension* (1986) and Executive Order 12689, *Debarment and Suspension* (1989) at 2 C.F.R. Part 180 and the Department of Homeland Security's regulations at 2 C.F.R. Part 3000 (Non procurement Debarment andSuspension).
 - c. These regulations restrict awards, subawards, and contracts with certain parties that are debarred, suspended, or otherwise excluded from or ineligible for participation in Federal assistance programs and activities. See 2 C.F.R. Part 200, Appendix II, ¶ H; and *Procurement Guidance for Recipients and Subrecipients Under 2 C.F.R. Each tier certifies to the tier above that it will not and has not used Federal appropriated funds to pay any person or organization for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any agency, a member of Congress, officer or employee of Congress, or an employee of a member of Congress in connection with obtaining any Federal contract, grant or any other award covered by 31 U.S.C. § 1352. Each tier must also disclose any lobbying with non-Federal funds that takes place in connection with obtaining any Federal award. Such disclosures are forwarded from tier to tier up to the non-Federal award. <u>See PDAT Supplement</u>, Chapter IV, ¶ 6.c and Appendix C, ¶ 4.
- d. <u>The following provides a Byrd Anti-Lobbying contract clause</u>:

"Byrd Anti-Lobbying Amendment, 31 U.S.C. § 1352 (as amended)

Contractors who apply or bid for an award of \$100,000 or more shall file the required certification. Each tier certifies to the tier above that it will not and has not used Federal appropriated funds to pay any person or organization for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any agency, a member of Congress, officer or employee of Congress in connection with obtaining any Federal contract, *The School Board of Pinellas County Prohibits Discrimination In All Purchasing and Contracting*

grant, or any other award covered by 31 U.S.C. § 1352. Each tier shall also disclose any lobbying with non-Federal funds that takes place in connection with obtaining any Federal award. Such disclosures are forwarded from tier to tier up to the recipient."


