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

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# Time for Tebow-Meyer reunion in NFL?

DAYTONA BEACH, Fla. — When another former Florida coach went to the NFL and tried to win with his former Gators quarterbacks, it didn't work.

But Steve Spurrier was trying to replicate the style of offense that worked so well in Gainesville, and the "Fun-n-Gun" wouldn't work in Washington for Danny Wuerffel and Shane Matthews.

This, however, could be different. Tim Tebow hasn't played baseball for 17 months, and back in the summer of 2019 he was batting a buck-63 with the Mets' Class AAA team in Syracuse (New York). It appeared his baseball fling had topped out the previous year in Class AA, where he hit .273 but with too little power to justify his too many strikeouts.

Last year was a COVID-19-induced washout that claimed the entire season for minor league baseball. Now Tebow is 33, awaiting spring training with the Mets and what figures to be his make-

or-break moment in a baseball career that first took root five years ago. Yes, time flies.

Before that, his football career dead-ended when it became apparent he just didn't have everything NFL coaches want in a quarterback — most notably, he didn't have an NFL arm. His dream of building an NFL career was done, and nothing could change that.

Or could it? Assuming you haven't already, consider Taysom Hill, who played for the Saints against the Buccaneers during Sunday's NFC playoff game. Officially listed as a backup quarterback, Hill lines up all over the field as a very important and useful weapon for the Saints. Even at 33, at least for a while, maybe that could be Tim Tebow.

Sure, that's been true of Tebow for many years, even before you ever heard of Taysom Hill, but it's especially fun to consider now because Urban Meyer just took over the Jaguars. Tebow's former college coach, whom he still holds in the highest esteem, is now an NFL coach in Tebow's hometown.

Tebow kinda-sorta downplayed the

idea in a late-week interview with TMZ Sports.

"Obviously, me and Coach are so close and we've talked about a lot of different things over the years," he said. "But for me, I'm super excited about spring training. So that's where my fo-

cus, kind of sports-wise, is right now. But are you kidding me? I loved playing for Coach and will always be supportive of him."

Did anyone hear a "no way" in there? Reportedly, when the Patriots brought Tebow to preseason camp in 2013, Bill Belichick was considering using Tebow in the Swiss Army Knife manner the Saints have so successfully employed with Hill. But Tebow stubbornly held on to his quarterback dream, which eventually saw him awaken as a minor league outfielder.

Unless something clicked over the past 17 months and he's suddenly capable of consistently putting wood to professional pitching, Tebow and the Mets might be done by the time the Jags spring minicamp is called to order in April. If it's ever gonna happen, it'll happen with Urban Meyer and Jacksonville.

Tebow should be well rested, he hasn't taken a hit in years and, given his off-field reputation, figures to be a very young 33.

After several decades of watching pro football, I can assure you he'd never have to try hitting a curveball.

## Jets' coaching hire a sign of overdue change

When was the last time that Jets' fans were truly happy?

That question kept pulsing through my mind on Thursday night, in the moments and hours after the Jets announced that 49ers defensive coordinator Robert Saleh would be their next head coach.

That news set off a wave of unrestrained joy and celebration on social media, the likes of which I've never seen in my five seasons covering the team.

Sure, most of the fans were happy when the Jets signed Le'Veon Bell two years ago. But many warned of the potential train wreck looming — and turned out to be right.

When the Jets made Joe Douglas their general manager in June 2019, there was also hope for the future. But there was an underlying distrust in CEO Christopher Johnson after the ugly breakup with previous GM Mike Maccagnan, and Adam Gase's role in it.

But it was hard to find those types of reservations with the Saleh hire.

It's not because Saleh, who turns 42 this week, is a lock to be a great head coach. There are too many variables, too many uncertainties to know how any person will fare their first time in the job.

But still, something about this whole thing felt right. The way the Jets set explained what they wanted in a new coach and how they'd find it. The amount and type of candidates they brought in. The person they chose in the end. All of it matched up.

The Jets seem to have a real plan. They seem to be ready to start to forge a true identity, something they haven't done since the days of Rex Ryan prowling the sideline.

For the first time in a long time, there is reason to believe the Jets are headed in the right direction.

### Delivering on the promise

The commitment to finding the best overall leader was something Jets fans wanted to hear. As was Johnson's clear explanation about how the search would work. He would work with Douglas and team President Hymie Elhai as a team to interview all the candidates. But Douglas' voice, and his two decades of NFL experience, would be taken the most seriously.

"We're looking for a person with great character and integrity," Douglas said on Jan. 5. "A person that's going to have outstanding vision of what they want the identity of this team to be moving forward, and then what's the detailed plan on how they want to achieve this identity, someone that's a great communicator, a great manager. We're going to cast a very wide net."

Teams regularly say things like that and don't back it up. But in this case, the Jets did exactly what they said.

By day seven of the search, they had talked to nine candidates through virtual interviews. Five of the candidates had defensive experience, four worked on the offensive side of the ball. Three of the candidates were over 50 with extensive experience, three were in their 40s and viewed as an up-and-comer, and three were emerging talents in their 30s.

The search had been wide and deep, as promised. And when the Jets took the interview process to the next step, it became clear that they were focused most on getting this thing right — not on the public perception of the search.

They had a long, in-person session with Saleh on Tuesday and into Wednesday, making him their first finalist. But then they let him walk out the door, immediately to an interview with the Eagles. And Jets fans got angry, thinking they had missed their chance with a coach who had been everything they were looking for.

But Douglas, Johnson and Elhai were just sticking to their progress.

They interviewed the other finalist, Titans offensive coordinator Arthur Smith.

Then they decided to offer the job to Saleh, who accepted.

### The final product

As I said in the beginning, it's impos-

sible to predict exactly what Saleh will be as a coach. You just don't know how these guys are going to react to the situation until they're the one making the decisions under pressure.

But there are a lot of reasons to believe that he can be the guy who changes the culture within the locker room.

His past players rave about him, including Richard Sherman, who congratulated Jets fans on landing Saleh and earlier this season raved about the job he did keeping together the 49ers' defense as it was ravaged by injury.

"It's week after week, and he never makes an excuse," Sherman told 49ers reporters. "I expect him to be a head coach next year because of what he's able to do."

"He's a leader of men. He can rally men. And that goes a long way."

And just about everyone who passed through the 49ers building during Saleh's four years there seems to think that he has what it takes to turn this thing around.

"I am so damn excited for Saleh," Joe Staley, the 49ers former All-Pro tackle said on Twitter. "He is a leader. Unbelievable man and coach. Can't wait to watch him turn around the Jets organization!"

That remains to be seen. But any process that ends with the Jets getting someone who was as sought after, and widely praised as Saleh is a sign that indeed this thing might be headed in the right direction.
