
Believe it or not, Kevin Harvick entered the Monster Energy NASCAR Cup Series weekend winless in 2019. The Stewart-Haas Racing driver who won eight times last year and finished third in the championship race had opportunities to win but could never live up to his nickname of "The Closer."

Harvick made sure he closed out the race Sunday at New Hampshire Motor Speedway, holding off Denny Hamlin, who caught him in the final two laps and bumped him twice before Harvick edged him at the line to win the Foxwoods Resort Casino 301.

"(Hamlin) got to me and tried to move me out the way," a relieved Harvick said after climbing out of his car. "I knew that was coming as close as he was. But I just hit the throttle down the back straightaway and I'm like, 'You're not getting under me again.' He drove to the outside, and I waited until he got near me then put a wheel on him."

The victory was Harvick's first in 21 races since he took the checkered flag at Texas Motor Speedway in November.

Hamlin saw the battle the same way Harvick did. "I wanted to just tap him there," Hamlin said, "but I didn't want to completely screw him, I wanted to give him a fair shot. Then he turned right and came up on me coming out of the corner. I don't know, I would have done the same thing. ... It was a great race."

Harvick, who won this race last year, benefited from a call by his crew chief. When many of the drivers brought their cars down pit road with 35 laps left for tires, Rodney Childers told Harvick to stay out. "It was really questionable with how that was going to go," Harvick said in victory lane. "It was a heck of a finish, closer than we wanted. Like I said, I would never have (made the call), but that's why he's the one on the box.'

Harvick earned his 46th Cup Series win and locked himself into the playoffs. Erik Jones finished third, Ryan Bla-

ney fourth and Matt DiBenedetto fifth for his second top-five of 2019. Martin Truex Jr., Ryan Newman, Kyle Busch, Joey Logano and Brad Keselowski rounded out the top 10.

Larson's woes: With 37 laps left, Kyle Larson hit the wall for a second time. Larson brought his car to the garage.

Back-to-back yellows: Kyle Busch, who led 118 laps, got loose on lap 214 and slid into the wall, bringing out the caution. On the ensuing restart, Larson tried to pass Alex Bowman on the inside but spun out with the rear of his No. 42 Chevrolet backing into the wall.

Stage 2: Aric Almirola, who stayed on the track after a late-stage caution, won the segment ahead of Logano, Newman and William Byron, who also didn't pit. Kyle Busch, who took tires, was fifth.

Costly crash: Clint Bowyer got loose as cars raced three-wide on a restart with six laps left in the second segment and careened into Truex, sending Truex

into the wall and his No. 19 Toyota into Bowyer's No. 14 Ford. Bowyer was eight points above the playoff cut line entering the race. Both cars were able to finish the second stage on the lead lap.

Wall banger: Ricky Stenhouse Jr. slammed hard into the Turn 2 wall on lap 136, ending his day. He cut his left front tire after side-by-side contact with Erik Jones, and when the tire blew, Stenhouse lost control of his No. 17 Ford. Stenhouse, who is winless this year, was one of a handful of drivers trying to creep up into the 16th and final playoff position. The Roush Fenway Racing driver faces a likely must-win situation. "The 20 (of Jones) ran over us," Stenhouse said. "He's been known to do that to us a couple times now lately. He'll get one coming his way before it's over with, or at least before I'm through with it."

Making contact: Daniel Suarez got loose and made contact with Daniel Hemric in Turn 2, sending Hemric's No. 8 Chevy into the wall and the No. 41 Ford of Suarez spinning. NASCAR waved the caution flag on lap 110, and the field headed back down pit road. Jones and Alex Bowman made contact on pit road when Jones was pulling out of his pit box and Bowman was trying to pull into his. Chase Elliott also had an issue on the pit stop. The No. 9 Hendrick Motorsports crew was forced to lift the hood and replace a belt.

IndyCar night in Iowa 'well worth the wait'

NEWTON, Iowa - That Mother Nature has a cheeky sense of humor, doesn't she? Throughout the week leading up to the Iowa 300, we heard from so many members of the NTT IndyCar Series community lamenting the scheduled start time of Saturday's "night" race — about how starting at 7:30 ET would allow the setting sun to scorch drivers' vision, along with the fans in the stands.

Mother Nature chuckled. Oh, you want a night race? I'll give you a night

Though no rain had fallen in Iowa for weeks, just minutes before green flag time, Mother Nature opened up the skies and let forth a wicked thunderstorm and torrential downpour that soaked the track and delayed the start of the Iowa 300 for more than four hours until the event became a twilight affair, with the green flag flying 10 minutes before the stroke of midnight.

Despite the obvious headaches a delay of that caliber causes – i.e. drying the track, keeping fans safe/entertained and IndyCar teams' mad dash to book local hotel rooms and flights for their crews in case the race was pushed to Sunday – it all worked out for the best.

Well, maybe not for everyone. Surely there were fans who couldn't wait around all night for the race to begin and left disappointed. But those who did stay – and there were plenty (bravo,

Iowa fans) - were treated to one of the best IndvCar races of the season.

"For all the fans who stayed out, weathered the storm literally, huge, huge thanks," said third-place finisher James Hinchcliffe. "I think it was well worth the wait. Hopefully everybody that did come and stayed for the race enjoyed the show. Felt pretty exciting from where we were sitting. Imagine from the outside. too."

From the outside, the race was thrill-

Though the numbers, highlighted by his 245 laps led, indicate Josef Newgarden's eventual victory was a foregone conclusion, a slew of contenders emerged throughout the night looking as if they might challenge him for the top spot on the podium.

Dale Coyne Racing rookie Santino Ferrucci grabbed the early headlines by blitzing the field at the start, jumping up six spots (12th to sixth) and appearing as if he might ambush the front-runners.

Newgarden's Penske teammates, Will Power and pole-sitter Simon Pagenaud, each looked strong as the three ran up front together early on. Ed Carpenter and his teammate Spencer Pigot quickly made a case that they were the class of the pack, as they bounded up the field into the top 10 in a heartbeat.

Hinchcliffe delivered a little deja vu, as he and his car seemed to grow stronger and stronger as the race went on, making it seem like he might have a shot at going back-to-back at Iowa.

Finally there was Scott Dixon, who through some combination of sorcery and strategy managed to go from being a back marker all race to closing the gap

to Newgarden in the final stint and finishing second.

All in all, it was a thrilling race, and one fans who stayed up to watch on TV or stayed at the speedway to watch in person deserved to see.

Did it make a significant difference that it was truly a night race? I bet the fans - not sweating through their clothes in the stands - thought so. I know Newgarden and Zach Veach did.

As we've learned through the first two years of the universal aero kit, the hotter the temperatures, the tougher it is for drivers to hang on to these cars. With track temperatures down, Veach said, they were able to put on a show with nearly 600 on-track passes.

"I think it would have been a much

worse race if it was in the day like it was supposed to be," said the young Andretti Autosport driver, who picked up his best finish of the season (seventh). "With the conditions that we had, we gained about 200 pounds of downforce. And honestly, I think it was just right.

"It was still just low enough that we were sliding around and we're struggling and we can't run in a pack at all. But it's good enough that you can feel confident to try and charge and pass people. I felt like we had a good balance, so I'm thankful for Mother Nature for pushing things back."

For Newgarden, it wasn't so much about the quality of racing as it was about the majesty. There's simply something special about Indy cars racing at night, he said.

"I think night is better just because it's always more exhilarating," Newgarden said. "The more races we can have under the lights with IndyCar would be better. They look better. It's obviously cooler in the summertime, easier on the fans, easier on us. I think it's just a lot more fun. It really brings the atmosphere out and makes it exciting."

I'd wager few fans disagree. Hopefully, that means in the coming years we can expect more of what we saw late Saturday night and early Sunday morning. Hopefully it won't be left to Mother Nature to make it so.

You'd have to believe that IndyCar, NBC and the speedway want to put the best possible product in front of their fans. At Iowa that means night racing. True night racing.

We saw its splendor Saturday night. Here's hoping we see it again next year.
