

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

Time for Arizona to make call on Miller



USA TODAY

Through more than three years of allegations and innuendo about whether head coach Sean Miller would be implicated directly in the corruption that infiltrated the University of Arizona bas-ketball program, the school stood by him. No matter how bad the headlines looked for Miller, no matter how much the ongoing NCAA investigation seemed like a guillotine inching toward his neck, Arizona never backed away from a coach who once seemed destined to return the Wildcats to the Final Four.

But now, at the very moment Miller But now, at the very moment miler has gained a degree of vindication, Ari-zona is paralyzed by dysfunction and indecision. With just one year left on his contract, Miller's time in Tucson has reached a boiling point, presenting the school with a choice whether to cut ties now or double down on Miller through the end of its NCAA case.

Instead, according to two people with knowledge of the situation who spoke to USA TODAY Sports on the condition of anonymity due to the sensitivity of the

situation, Arizona is doing nothing.

Since Arizona's season ended

March 1 due to a self-imposed postseason ban, it has in essence created a son ball, it has in essence treated a standoff designed to either get Miller to walk away from the last \$1.5 million he would be owed if fired or come back next season while the clock runs out on his contract – a situation that practically never happens at the Power Five level.

"There's no communication at all" between Miller and the school's adminithe matter said.

Though Arizona President Dr. Robert

Though Arizona President Dr. Robert

Robbins stated publicly in recent days that he wants Miller to return as coach next season, he communicated in a brief meeting last week that he couldn't get a contract extension approved by the school's board of regents and left Miller with the impression that Robbins would prefer a parting of ways, according to one of the people, who is familiar with Miller's thinking. Even if Robbins wants to move Arizo-

na past the Miller era, doing so without alienating some of the school's biggest athletic boosters who are loyal to Miller

or further burdening his cash-strapped athletic department won't be easy.

At this point Miller does not intend to

resign, according to one of the people, resign, according to one of the people, and the uncertainty over his punishment from the NCAA eliminates him from getting hired elsewhere in college basketball during this cycle.

At the same time, the two people told USA TODAY Sports that Miller is con-

USA 10DAY sports that smiler is con-flicted about a 2021-22 season without some kind of signal of support from the school, even a school-friendly token ex-tension that would be easy to get out of. Not only would daily speculation about Miller's future consume all the ox-

about Miller's ruture consume ail the ox-ygen next season, but recruiting would basically grind to a halt. And with the NCAA about to grant every player a one-time free transfer, there's no guarantee Arizona's current roster – which projects to be in the preseason top 25 -would come back intact. Most coaches would come back intact. Most coaches would rather just get fired than try to keep that circus together. It's hard to see the upside for Arizona

in that situation. If Miller comes back on in that situation. If Miller comes back on the last year of his contract, the smoke clears from the NCAA investigation and school officials decide that keeping him long term is their best option, they've unnecessarily kneecapped his rebuilding job. By the same token, if they let Miller coach next year and then get rid of him, the new coach inherits a deplet-ed roster, no recruiting class and the brunt of whatever sanctions are imposed without the kind of head start in

D21-22 that might be valuable.

Hanging over all this is uncertainty

about when the NCAA is going to rule on Arizona's case. Currently, it's in the hands of the new Independent Ac-countability Resolution Process (IARP), the off-ramp where complex NCAA cases are handled. But the IARP has been moving at a glacial pace, and there are other FBI-related cases (like Kansas') that are ahead of Arizona in the pipeline. It might take even another year

pipeline. It might take even another year before the case gets resolved.

So here's the part that's hard to figure: If Arizona has come this far with Miller, why would it tuck and run now?
Though the school only made its NCAA Notice of Allegations public Friday after a judge ordered it to be released, Arizona officials have known the scope of the charges for months.

In totality the allegations are heavy, with five Level 1 (most serious) violations, ranging from academic fraud or

with nive Level I (most serious) viola-tions, ranging from academic fraud or-chestrated by former assistants to for-mer assistant Book Richardson accept-ing bribes to steer players toward cer-tain agents. It's serious stuff, and tain agents. It's serious stuff, and Arizona is likely going to end up with significant penalties, particularly given the public pressure on the NCAA to make hay out of the FBI investigation that uncovered all kinds of college basketball corruption.

But the only charge directed at Miller specifically was the catch-all NCAA rule that presumes head coaches are re-sponsible for violations committed by their assistants and failing to monitor Richardson's relationship with Christian Dawkins, the middleman who got caught up in the FBI's sting operation

into college basketball recruiting.
For Miller, just as notable was what didn't appear in the notice.
No mention of Deandre Ayron, who was the subject of an explosive ESPN re-

was the subject of an explosive ESPN re-port in 2018 claiming, according to an unnamed person familiar with the FBI investigation, that Miller was caught on a wiretap discussing a \$100,000 pay-ment with Christian Dawkins. Miller strongly denied that, saying he had "never discussed" paying Ayton with

Dawkins.

There was also no mention of point guard Jahvon Quinerly, who decommitguard sarvoir quinery, win occomment ted from Arizona after an unnamed player matching his description ap-peared in FBI documents allegedly ac-cepting \$15,000 from Richardson. Qui-nerly was later cleared by the NCAA.

There was no mention of Brian Bowen or Nassir Little, players whom de-fendants in the case said Arizona had

tendants in the case said Arizona had been willing to pay for. There was no mention of the video played during Dawkins' 2019 trial of a conversation with an undercover agen

conversation with an undercover agent in which Dawkins alleges Miller had knowledge of illegal recruiting.

After all the mud thrown at Miller over the past three-years-plus, what was the NCAA really able to pin on him

at the end of the day? Not that much.
To be clear, none of that proves Miller's innocence.

But had Arizona fired Miller the mo ment that Richardson was arrested, it would have made sense. If it had gotten rid of him when wiretaps started gettin played in court and his name started coming up on the witness stand, it would have made sense. At the time, though, Miller had been

to three Elite Eights and two Sweet 16s in

his first eight seasons.

Now, with no new evidence against him and a notice that isn't nearly as bad for Miller as many expected, it looks like Arizona is growing cold on him because

Arizona is growing cold on him because of his recent record.

The cloud of investigation at Arizona has undeniably made recruiting more difficult. Still, in a perverse way, it's been an impressive coaching job. Arizo-

been an impressive coaching job. Arizo-na went 17-9 this year, playing hard to the end despite no postseason carrot. After three years of fighting back all kinds of allegations about how its pro-gram was run under Miller, Arizona has come to the moment when there's a nath toward conclusion. One way or another, it's time for decisions to be made

actly what kind of an impact COVID-19 actly what kind of an impact COVID-19 would have on the NFL. This time a year ago, the country was going into lock-down and sporting events were getting scrapped. But as free agency kicked off, the NFL still had a six-month cushion before games began, and many assumed the country would have returned to normal by then. But as the games took place in empty or sparsely filled stadiums, the NFL lost an estimated \$3 billion of its usual \$16 billion revenue

The previous year's revenue determines the salary cap, but the NFL and NFL Players Association had agreed last fall that the salary cap for 2021 would not fall below \$175 million and they would split the losses of 2020 over multiple seasons. Last month the NFL announced the cap would be no less than \$180M, and many teams, players and agents hoped it would approach \$190M. So a year after they structured con-

tracts with an initial anticipation of op-

tracts with an initial anticipation of operating under a cap of roughly \$2.00M, teams now must figure out how to field rosters using about \$28 million less.
"That's a dramatic departure from what the expectations were going to be prepandemic." Joel Corry, former NFL agent-turned-CBS Sports analyst, told USA TODAY Sports. "The cap had been going up 5 to 8% each year, so \$210 (million) was a reasonable estimate. ... No-body contemplated the cap taking a

body contemplated the cap taking a steep drop like it is going to this year." A number of teams would have found themselves in bad shape even without the depression of this year's figure. When the offseason began, projections bad this contemplation of the projections bad this contemplation. had the Saints \$100 million over the cap.

As of Wednesday's announcement, the As of wednesday's announcement, the Saints had released six players, restruc-tured the contracts of seven players and still found themselves roughly \$31 mil-lion over the mark, according to Over-TheCap.com.

Between now and March 17, the league will see many players released who a year ago would have fallen under that "surprise" cut category. Or teams could try to trade such players. A perfect example is Miami linebacker Kyle Van Noy. Last spring, he signed a four-year, \$51 million contract. But now it appears likely he will be either released or traded to help Miami create roughly \$9 million

to help Mainti Cetaete loughly 39 liminoi in cap space.

The coming days also will feature creative moves by contract negotiators. A move made popular by the Saints in previous years and now catching on among others is restructuring deals and making additional traiting and the previous to the saints in the saints and th tacking additional voidable years onto

contracts to massage salary caps. The Cardinals used this strategy when sign-ing JJ Watt to a deal classified as a two-year pact that actually pays him for longer.

The NFL and NFLPA "allow the void-The NFL and NFLPA "allow the void-ing dummy years to be used for pro-ration purposes even though they're not real years, and they void the last day of the league year or some specified date," Corry explained. "It's a legal way to Corry explained. "It's a legal way to cheat the cap until they close it. I expect a number of the guys you see in free agency signing one-year deals on paper are four-year deals that void to one."

As Corry pointed out, young players

may find it in their best interests to bet on themselves through shorter deals this year. Older players may benefit from long-term security offered by multiple years

But for now, teams and players will feel the crunch. The show must go on.

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
