

'I'm not coming out': Dodgers ace **Buehler throws his first MLB shutout**

PHOENIX - Los Angeles Dodgers starter Walker Buehler walked off the field after eight innings Monday night, and as he passed manager Dave Roberts in the dugout, blurted out, "I'm not coming out of this game!"

This was not going to be a repeat of Roberts' controversial decision 12 days ago to remove Clayton Kershaw after seven innings of a perfect game against the Minnesota Twins.

Buehler was not throwing a perfect game, giving up two singles to this point, but he had a chance for the first shutout of his career.

He wasn't about to let it go.

"I would have been really upset," Buehler said. "I think it's kind of hard not to have that emotion."

One inning later, Buehler was still on the mound when center fielder Cody Bellinger caught Christian Walker's line drive for the final out. Buehler broke into a huge grin, walked toward catcher Will Smith, and hugged him. The crowd of 17,750 at Chase Field gave him a huge ovation.

Buehler had his first shutout in the 98th start of his career. He gave up three hits and struck out 10, throwing 108 pitches in the 4-0 victory over the Arizona Diamondbacks.

'That was ol' Walker right there," Dodgers shortstop Trea Turner said. "He was unbelievable."

Buehler, who had not pitched longer than 5 % innings in his first three starts, put on an absolute pitching clinic. He was still throwing 96 mph in the ninth inning, retired 15 consecutive batters until David Peralta's two-out single in the ninth inning, and never permitted a base runner to advance past second base.

It was not only the first shutout but the first complete game of the 2022 season after a shortened spring training. Roberts wasn't going to stand in

the way of Buehler's personal milestone after removing Kershaw with 80 pitches in a perfect game.

Roberts had a 110-pitch limit on Buehler, who was at 98 pitches when he went out for the ninth inning. Even if Buehler hadn't said anything, Roberts planned to send him out for the ninth, knowing he was going to have an extra day of rest before his next start.

"I know it's something he always wanted," Roberts said. "He deserved it. He earned it. It was fun to watch him pitch tonight."

Buehler never labored. There was no stressful inning. He was in full command of all of his pitches.

"I think there have been outings where you might have seen more velocity or it looks or is perceived as more dominant," Roberts said. thought tonight was as well-pitched of a game as he's pitched in the big leagues. I really believe that."

Roberts said if Buehler had given up one more hit or base runner he was pulling him for closer Craig Kimbrel, shutout or not, and no matter how furious Buehler may have reacted.

"I was very relieved," Roberts said,

laughing. "The stars aligned right there.

Someone joked with Roberts afterward, asking if Buehler still would have been in the game if he had a perfect game after seven innings, and Roberts could only laugh.

This was different, of course.

Buehler wasn't coming off a forearm/elbow injury that sidelined him the last six weeks of the season like Kershaw. Buehler had been training all winter and picked up a baseball well before January, unlike Kershaw.

"Hey, he was built up," Roberts said. 'They're not all created equal."

This won't be remembered as part of baseball folklore, but considering no National League pitcher has thrown more than two shutouts in a season since Kershaw in 2016, with Hyun-Jin Ryu the last Dodger to throw a shutout in 2019, Buehler was honored to join

"I was more pleased with just kind of getting back on track and getting my mechanics where I want them," said Buehler, who entered the game with a 4.02 ERA.

Mission accomplished.

"He went right at them, and they didn't really know what to do with it,"

Just like Buehler went right after Roberts, making sure to remove any doubt that he deserved to finish the

"You've seen how protected we are here, and I think that's a good thing and the smart thing," Buehler said. "But I would have been really upset."

Now, he may have won Roberts' confidence to be left in longer. Kershaw has 15 shutouts, so Buehler has some catching up to do.

"Kersh has kind of dominated and pushed and been really, really good in a lot innings," Buehler said. "I don't know if it's a chasing him thing. It's just a standard of what I want to be able to

Welfare for the rich is OK when it's for stadiums

Local leaders are again falling for scam of bailing out billionaires

Build your own playgrounds, billionaires.

You want a shiny new stadium for the team that has padded your net worth? Or a swanky, state-of-the-art practice facility for the franchise that sets you apart from the rest of the uber rich? Then write the checks yourself.

These stadium boondoggles are nothing more than welfare for the rich, and the people who will be on the hook for it are wise to the con.

A poll released Monday by Siena College found that 63% of New York voters oppose the \$600 million the state has pledged for a new stadium for the Buffalo Bills. Of those who live upstate, and so would theoretically be more likely to be Bills fans, 68% disapproved of the state's contribution to the stadium project.

In a country that can barely see eye to eye on anything, that is a staggering level of agreement.

It also echoes the feelings of residents in a Nashville neighborhood near the Tennessee Titans stadium, almost 90% of whom said in a February survey that they opposed public funding for a new venue. Tennessee lawmakers last week approved \$500 million in state funding for a new, enclosed stadium.

And yet, after several years of relative fiscal sanity when it comes to these handouts for billionaires, state and local leaders are once again falling for the scam. Rather than making team owners pay for their new stadiums or



arenas themselves, or limiting public money to infrastructure, officials are back throwing money at the rich.

"Study after study has shown that stadiums are terrible public investments. The taxpayers financing them rarely want to pay for them," Victor Matheson, a sports economist at Holy Cross, wrote in an analysis of the Buffalo deal, which he described as "one of the worst stadium deals in recent memory. "So why," he asked, "are governments willing to subsidize them?"

An excellent question. As our wealth gap continues to widen, this country's ability to rationalize welfare depending on the recipient is mindboggling. We decry it as a waste when it's money and services that keep the working poor afloat, even if those benefits can actually help break the cycle of poverty. Yet when corporations and pro sports teams - entities that can afford to pay their way – get public funds or tax breaks, it's shrugged off as the cost of doing business.

It's considered a moral failing when someone making minimum wage, or less, needs public assistance. But it's a community good when Bills owners Terry and Kim Pegula, who have a net worth of \$5.8 billion according to Forbes, ask for it.

People struggling to make ends meet aren't deserving of a helping hand. But Carolina Panthers owner David Tepper, a billionaire many times over who walked away from a deal for a new practice facility in South Carolina because public funding didn't come through in the way he wanted, is.

The rationale is that these projects benefit the entire community through the jobs and increased revenue they generate. But that myth has been debunked. Repeatedly.

Team owners will also hold the threat of moving elsewhere over their communities and fans; in defending the state funding for the Bills, New York Gov. Kathy Hochul said other cities were circling around the smallmarket team.

Yet the Bills have never left Buffalo. Yes, Dean Spanos took his ball and went to Los Angeles when the people of San Diego declined to give him millions to build a stadium. Mark Davis moved the Raiders to Las Vegas after that city offered to build him a home -

which has gone really well, by the way. But especially now that Los Angeles has two NFL teams, there is not a glut of cities in position to lure a professional team away. Not at the considerable expense that's going to be involved, anyway. So why not call the owners' bluff?

They have the means to pay their own way. They simply don't want to.

Sounders chase history in Champions League final

TUKWILA, Wash. - It was probably not the intent of Seattle Sounders coach Brian Schmetzer to create an unfiltered catch phrase in the aftermath of a historic accomplishment by his club.

"This is a massive (expletive) deal for the club, OK? This is a big deal," Schmetzer said in the locker room after the Sounders advanced to the finals of the CONCACAF Champions League for the first time in club history.

That short little sound bite has become the marketing cornerstone for the Sounders heading into the first leg of the final against LigaMX club Pumas on Wednesday night in Mexico City.

Schmetzer is right. It is a big deal. Even Marshawn Lynch thinks so, cutting a promo for the team using Schmetzer's words.

It's big because no Major League Soccer team has won the CCL since its current format was adopted in 2008 and Seattle may have the best shot of any league team to date.

'Sigi (Schmid) always used to say, 'We want to be the first team to do this. We want to be the first team to do that, because we're Seattle Sounders," Schmetzer said this week before the $team\, departed\, for\, Mexico.\, ``Not\, because$ we're part of MLS, but that was our inherent culture that we continue to try and build.

"I would echo Sigi's words. We want to be the first one to capture a CCL title. It's a big, massive opportunity."

Seattle is the fifth MLS team to make the CCL final, joining Real Salt Lake (2011), CF Montreal (2015), Toronto FC (2018) and LAFC (2020). MLS has come close to breaking through in those previous opportunities. RSL lost the second leg at home to Monterrey 1-0 in 2011 after a 2-2 draw in Mexico. Montreal played Club América to a 1-1 draw at Estadio Azteca before losing 4-2 at home.

Toronto reached a penalty shootout against Chivas de Guadalajara before losing 4-2 on PKs. And LAFC in a onegame final in 2020 led 1-0 before two goals from Tigres inside the final 20

The Sounders may have the best chance to end the drought for MLS. Seattle will host the second leg on May 4, the first time the CCL final has been decided over two games since 2019. And unlike the earlier rounds of the tournament, road goals are not a tiebreaker in the final.

You want to win things. You want to win trophies. That's what you're going to remember after your career," Seattle midfielder Albert Rusnák said. "This is not only for myself, but for everybody here. We're aware of the fact that no MLS team has won it before. All these things. We might not say it as often as you guys would like but everybody is aware of it."

The Sounders have made the Champions League a priority for most of their time since joining MLS in 2009. This year is the seventh time the Sounders have appeared in the tournament and the fifth time they have advanced to at least the quarterfinals.

Even though Seattle has the advantage of hosting the second leg at home, Rusnák said the approach Wednesday will be the same as it was for earlier road matches in the tournament.


'We're not going there to get a tie, or not to lose the game by a couple of goals. We're going there to win the game," Rusnák said. "Ultimately, that's the mentality that we've had so far. ... The mentality is to win the game."
